NEW TITLE  Defined in 1948 by the United Nations as “the denial of the right of existence of entire human groups,” genocide has been with us since the beginning of history and is a key element to the study of world history at nearly every level. The most widely studied and catastrophic examples are, however, historically close to the present day: the Nazi Holocaust, “ethnic cleansing” in Bosnia-Herzegovina, tribal warfare in Rwanda and more.

However, the *Encyclopedia* is the first comprehensive reference to cover the international history of crimes against humanity — not just genocide or the Holocaust. Articles span the fields of history, film/drama, literature, law, psychology, sociology and political science. In addition, the *Encyclopedia* spans the globe to explain the issues behind crimes against humanity and human rights issues as they relate to individual countries and the world at large. It traces the history of events that qualify as genocide and crimes against humanity, profiles perpetrators and heroes, and explains international laws and law proceedings aimed at ending such atrocities. It also delves into depictions and manifestations of the phenomenon, such as propaganda, sociological and philosophical explanations, literature and film. In addition, multidisciplinary contents are cross-referenced to enrich readers' full understanding of the subject matter.

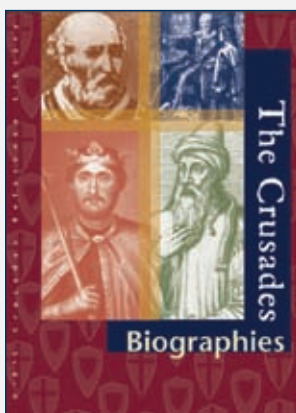
